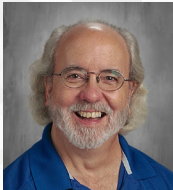

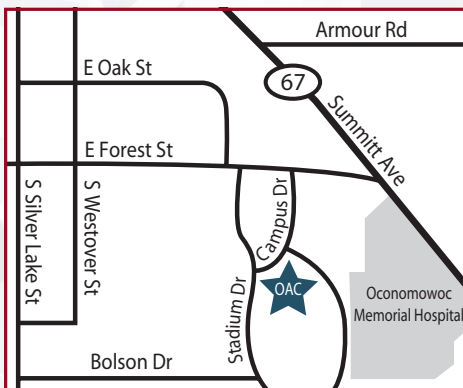

The OAC is located at 641 E. Forest Street and is part of the Oconomowoc High School campus. It is located in the south central part of Oconomowoc immediately west of Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital, one block west of Summit Avenue (Hwy 67) which is the main north/south artery into the city.

Artrageous – Where the Arts Come Together on One Stage

Discover the world of Artrageous where the arts collide on the OAC’s Main Stage in a colorful, high octane concert with surprises at every turn! The audience will experience firsthand the thrill of exploring everything the arts have to offer in this multi-faceted and uplifting show.

Based outside of Albuquerque, New Mexico, the troupe of 10 talented artists offers an interactive performance that incorporates many different art forms on the same stage. The magic starts as soon as the audience enters the theater, as they become immersed in an exciting whirlwind of color, splashes of sound, and wildly wonderful movement.

Artrageous visual artists use bold colors with hands and brushes as they work side by side with the troupe’s vocalists, musicians, dancers, and life-size puppets as they race to complete giant masterpieces before the last note. Audience members are invited to join the troupe on stage to interact with artists and dancers.

All the while, live musicians are performing popular musical styles from pop to country to Artrageous original music with powerful vocalists creating smooth harmonies. Artrageous dancers incorporate moves that inspire the audience to dance in the aisles and at their seats.

Performing more than 3,000 shows around the world for theater goers and celebrities alike, Artrageous artists started out as children’s theater and street performers during the 1980s in Vancouver, Canada.



“We’re very passionate about what we do, and inspiring audiences of all ages through art is an integral part of our existence. Artrageous is not your normal show. We try to combine as many art forms as possible. The show is so joyful, and we count on the audience to make it a very unique and interactive event,” said Lauri Francis of Artrageous.

The artists aren’t the only ones having all the fun. Everyone in the audience is encouraged to bring their t-shirts, sneakers, or ball caps, and step into the free Artrageous Splatter Station at the end of the show to get their gear custom splattered by an Artrageous artist and leave the show with their own one-of-a-kind wearable artwork! They will also give away one of the original paintings created during the show.

“We encourage the audience to get dressed up artrageously, and be ready to move and interact if they want to. It’s the audience’s time to shine – it really is their show. Come and have a great time and leave inspired and feeling little lighter,” added Francis.

OAC Info

No Food is permitted in the theaters except for beverages sold at the OAC concession stand, with the cap or cover on, or where allowed in the lobby area.

Where Can I Sit?

All 759 seats in the Neudecker Main Stage Theater offer excellent views and acoustics. Our box office can be of service with any questions you may have.



The OAC is ADA compliant. We have a limited number of wheelchair accessible seats. Please let the box office representative know that you will need accessible seating at the time of purchase. Our circle driveway allows easy drop off and parking that is next to the front entrance. Wheelchair accessible doors and no steps to the front doors make entering and exiting simple. A gradual slope in the theater allows for easy and safe admittance.

The Little Theater is also ADA compliant. Since this space is used for a variety of different set ups from general seating to a cabaret theater, the number of seats depends on the type of show. Again, the box office can answer any questions or aid you with accessibility concerns.

When to Arrive

It is recommended that patrons arrive approximately 20 minutes prior to the start of a performance. This allows for time to park, check your coat (a free service at the OAC), use of the restrooms, and finding your seat without feeling rushed.

Late Arrivals

Out of courtesy to the performers and audience, patrons arriving after the performance has begun will be seated at the discretion of house management – possibly not until intermission.

Seat selection may not be available 1/2 hour prior to performances.

Bringing Children

Patrons are discouraged from bringing any child younger than the age of 6 to performances, unless that particular performance is geared toward or appropriate for younger audiences.

Parents are encouraged to contact the box office for information about the appropriateness of a given performance for younger children.

Booster Seats are available. Check with an usher for assistance, first-come-first-served.

IF YOUR CHILDREN ATTEND A PERFORMANCE WITH YOU, A TICKET WILL NEED TO BE PURCHASED FOR THEM.

This includes children of all ages, including infants. We now offer a Lapsit ticket (not available for all shows) for young children (infants and toddlers) so they can attend age appropriate performances. PLEASE NOTE: parents are responsible to supervise their children when in the theater and lobby.

Box Office

The Box Office is located in the lobby of the arts center at 641 East Forest Street, Oconomowoc, WI 53066. The OAC is adjacent to Oconomowoc High School and is just west of Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital.

To Purchase Tickets

- In Person during regular business hours or 90 minutes before event time.
- Over the Phone by calling 262-560-3172 during regular business hours or 90 minutes before event time.
- Online at www.theOAC.net, 24/7.

Payment/Processing

- In Person at the Box Office: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, cash, and local checks accepted.
- Over the Phone and Online: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express accepted.
- All Service Fees and Taxes are included in the price of the ticket.
- Mailing your order requires an additional postage and handling fee of \$2.50, or place your order at will call for FREE. The box office will not mail tickets less than one week prior to the event.
- Full payment is required on all orders. **ALL SALES FINAL. Sorry, no refunds.**
- Exchanges are permitted 48 hours prior to event time subject to availability. Exchanges must be for a ticket for the current season or converted to a gift certificate.
- Accessibility to the OAC is available to everyone. Patrons needing special seating or access should call ahead to 262-560-3172. The OAC will provide assistance.
- Hearing impaired patrons may have FREE access to the OAC's FM assisted listening system. Call the box office ahead of time to have one reserved. Visually impaired patrons, requiring signing, should call two weeks prior to the performance to make arrangements. This is also a FREE service.
- The OAC rarely cancels events due to weather related conditions.

Ways to Save

The OAC offers discounted tickets for seniors ages 60 and older, military personnel, youth ages 6 to 19, and a lapsit ticket (not available for all shows) for young children (infants and toddlers) attending age appropriate performances. We also offer group rates for groups of ten or more patrons attending the same performance.

Putting Group Tickets On Hold

A group is defined by ten or more patrons attending the same performance. If you are ordering tickets for a group and would like to have us hold your reservation for a later date, you may place the order with a **20% nonrefundable deposit** or a **nonrefundable order of 10 tickets** (whichever is greater) based on the group rate ticket price and the total number of tickets you would like to put on hold. When finalizing your group order you may do so over the phone or in person no later than six weeks prior to the date of the event (eight weeks for *A Kodachrome Christmas*). **This offer is not available online** and applies to group sales only.

Holds do not apply to special events or any shows in the Little Theater.

Occasionally there may be a misprint within this program guide. We will make every effort to correct the error as soon as possible. We reserve the right to change program schedules as needed to accommodate demand or building use conflicts.

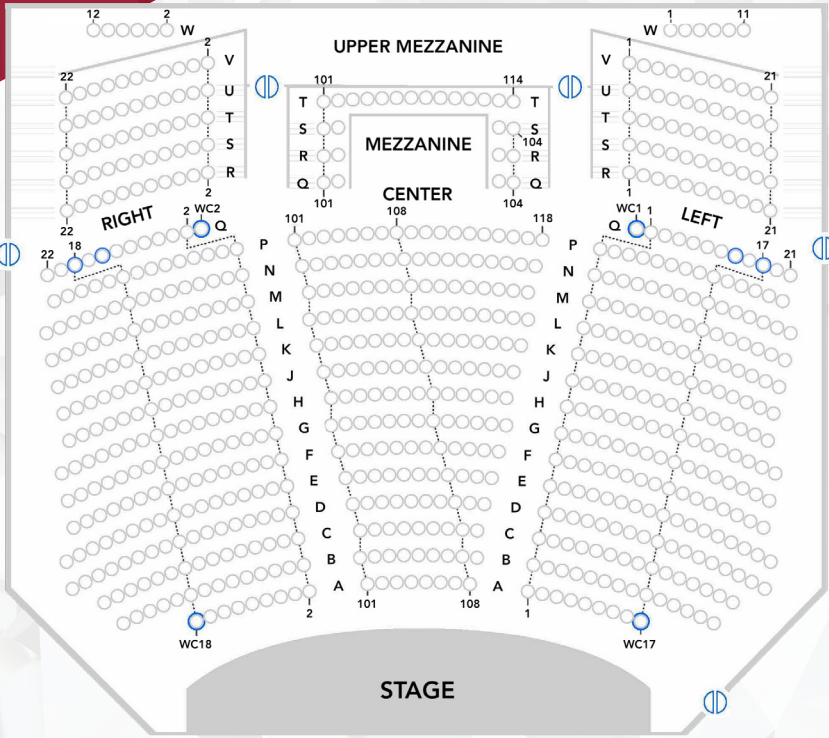

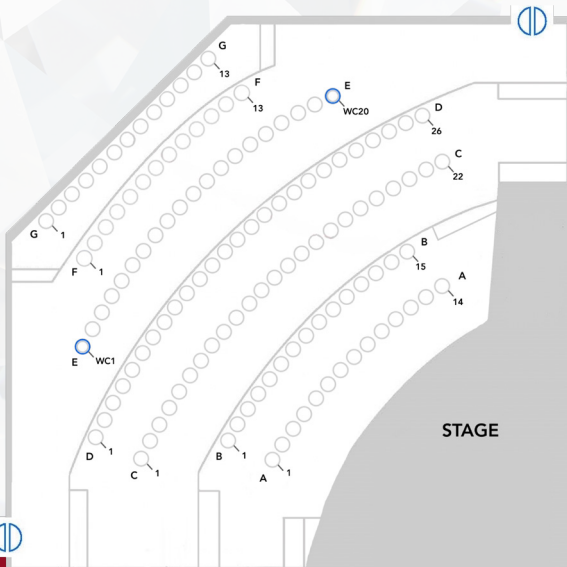

OPEF 15 Year Celebration

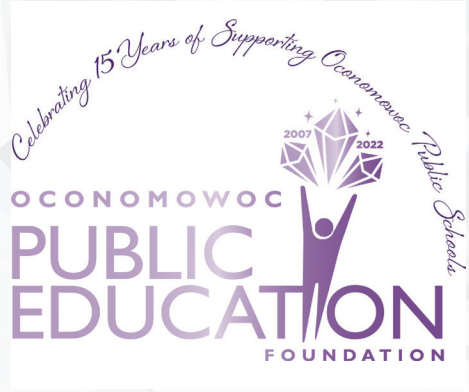
● Special Event | July 14, 2022

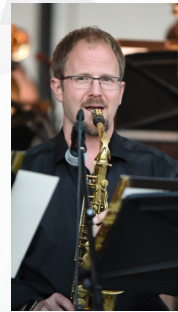

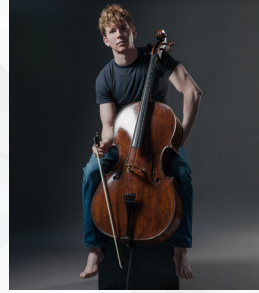

New York Times bestselling author, musician and radio host Michael Perry returns to the OAC's intimate Cabaret Café in the Little Theater where he will share two evenings of hilarious and heartfelt storytelling and music, hoping (in his words) to find "that sweet spot where self-deprecation, sincerity, and goofiness intertwine."

Perry is no stranger to the Lake Country area, nor the OAC stage, as people are drawn to the humorist's home-grown yarn spinning about life and the strength of a Midwest community. His bestselling memoirs include "Population: 485," "Truck: A Love Story," "Coop," "Visiting Tom," "The Jesus Cow," "Montaigne in Barn Boots" and more.

Raised on a small Midwestern dairy farm, Perry put himself through nursing school while working on a ranch in Wyoming, then detoured into writing by happy accident. He lives with his wife and two

daughters in rural northwestern Wisconsin, where he serves on the local volunteer fire and rescue service and has a handful of chickens.

Perry performs widely as a humorist, tours with his band the Long Beds, hosts the nationally-syndicated "Tent Show Radio," and also writes his "Roughneck Grace" weekly column for the "Wisconsin State Journal." A collection of his short stories and newspaper columns titled "Hunker: Essays on Human Connection" will be released in early 2023.

"Sometimes we have to hunker down, like we did the last two years of the pandemic. It's a way of taking care of others around you and also preparing for something better. We're all too connected on-line. My show is about how we're all just trying to make real human connections," explained Perry.

Popular Milwaukee TV and radio personality, prolific actor on both stage and screen and all-around nice guy, John McGivern returns to Oconomowoc to help celebrate the OAC's 15th anniversary season in *A Kodachrome Christmas*.

Starring McGivern as the colorful cable access TV hostess, Earlene Hoople, the hilariously touching "one-woman" show will take place just in time for the holiday season at 7 p.m. Saturday, December 17, and 1 and 5 p.m. Sunday, December 18.

"The first time I did the show was in 2011. It was originally written for a woman, and I thought, 'I could do that!' I was so excited because the show is so funny and much more than about me dressing up as a woman. The character of Earlene is very real, and she is not over the top. Her career as a TV hostess connects with what I do for a living, so it's very sweet," said McGivern.

A Kodachrome Christmas was written and directed by Pat Hazell. One of the original writers for NBC's "Seinfeld" and a "Tonight Show" veteran, the critically acclaimed playwright and contributing commentator to "National Public Radio," Hazell is recognized for his genuinely funny Americana humor and his salute to nostalgia.

"Working together with Pat in this role has been an amazing collaboration. He always dives in and is really gifted at finding a universal voice. We've changed some of the commercials and updated references to offer something a little different, but the audience will still really recognize themselves in these stories," added McGivern.

McGivern's other one-man shows, "The Wonder Bread Years," "The Early Years of John McGivern," "Midsummer Night McGivern" and "Home for the Holidays" tell stories of being the third born of six kids in a working-class Irish Catholic family in Milwaukee.

His latest project, "John McGivern's Main Streets" is a destination travel show that takes his unique style of storytelling throughout the Midwest. He and his team just started filming season two in June.

Of course, the residents of Oconomowoc will never forget when their own main street and community were featured in an episode of his Emmy Award-winning work "Around the Corner with John McGivern" in March 2014.
