


Student Achievements

OASD math scores increased since 2019


The percentage of OASD students scoring in the advanced/ proficient achievement range in both math and ELA increased by over 3% in both content areas from 2021/22 to 2022/23.

Student Achievements

Building Strong Early Literacy Skills

During the 2022-23 school year, a comprehensive team of elementary school staff worked together to better understand the Science of Reading research. The group then spent over 50 hours evaluating new curriculum options to help our students develop stronger foundational literacy skills. Several staff members and classrooms also participated in pilot programs to evaluate literacy tools and this work resulted in the adoption of a new literacy curriculum for grades 5K-6.







Performance Arts at the OASD Intermediate Schools

The OASD intermediate schools offer three, year-long performance arts options for grades 5-6, and up to six semester or year-long performance arts options for grades 7-8.

Both intermediate schools also offer a large-scale musical theater production each year along with music-focused clubs like jazz band.



An Exceptional Arts Experience For All Grades

The OASD has offered an exceptional arts experience for students for many decades and that tradition continues to grow. Students in grades 5K-6 participate in a robust arts program that includes regular guest artist projects and experiences. These projects are created for display in our schools but also as public art installations at locations throughout our community.

Visual and Performance Arts at OHS

OHS offers 13 visual arts courses including AP-level courses along with optional arts clubs and pathway experiences.



OHS offers 16 performance arts courses including International Baccalaureate (IB) level courses along with optional music clubs and collaborative performance experiences.

Life-Ready Curriculum

OASD is committed to developing skills and habits that will ensure our students will graduate ready for success in career, college, and life.

In 2022-23, our students began a new life-ready curriculum to help them learn, develop, and practice these life-ready skills and habits so that our future OASD graduates are prepared to balance various life aspects including academic, emotional, social, physical, and financial well-being, to lead a healthy and well-rounded life after high school.

Community Partnership Achievements



2023 Facility Referendum

In spring, our community supported a \$38.6M facility referendum to replace the HVAC system and roof sections at Oconomowoc High School and build an addition, replace roof sections, and replace the gym floor at Ixonia Elementary School. Work on these projects is already underway.

Positive Fund Balance

The General Fund Balance improved to a positive \$27 million as of June 30, 2023. The district's General Fund Balance remains at a level consistent with sound financial practice and Board policy. The District's strong financial position was noted in our recent Moody's rating report and provided for advantageous borrowing rates on our new referendum debt.

Why Does Fund Balance Matter?

Each year, the OASD fund balance has peaks and valleys in correlation with receipt of annual property taxes and state equalization aid. Maintaining such a positive fund balance ensures the OASD does not need to borrow money on a short-term basis for operational expenses during a funding valley. That saves money on interest costs and helps maintain our high credit rating.

Long-Range Capital Improvement Fund Continues to Grow

Fund 46 was created to allow the district to save for long-range capital maintenance and improvements. The school board approved transferring \$497,000 of the 2022-23 operating margin to increase Fund 46.





OASD Moody Bond Rating:

Strong Financial Performace

In a budgetary environment characterized by restricted, and often minimal, revenue growth, OASD must remain focused and exercise careful restraint over expenditures, ensuring that every dollar is allocated to its optimal use.



\$8.25 3.2% lower than 2022

In 2022-23, as a result of significant equalized property value growth within the municipalities that comprise the OASD, the school board approved an additional debt service levy of approximately \$9M. This additional levy made a slight increase to the 2022-23 total mill rate but still kept the rate below the 2021-22 amount. The additional levy was used to pay off callable maturities on the district's 2007 referendum debt. **This action saved approximately \$780,000 of interest expense on the debt and resulted in approximately \$4,000,000 in interest cost avoidance** on the first phase of debt borrowing for the 2023 referendum.
