COMPLETING CLUB REGISTRATION

TO JOIN A CLUB PLEASE DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. **Students log into** "Student Access", "Online Forms", "Club Registration". Complete the steps in "Club Registration" including the signing of Random Drug Testing participation.
- Parent/Guardian logs into "Family Access", "Online Forms", "Club Registration".
 Complete the steps in "Club Registration" including the signing of Random Drug Testing participation.
- 3. **Parent/Guardian logs into** "Family Access", "Fee Management". Add a fee, add club participation fee. Pay the \$45 fee*. This fee covers participation in an unlimited number of clubs.

When all steps are complete, you will be added to the club roster. If you have trouble with registration, please come into the High School Office, or call Liz Hofschulte at 262-560-3114 and we will walk you through the process.

If a meal assistance program has been approved, you may request the \$45.00 club registration fee be waived or reduced. Please contact Nancy DeYoung at 262-560-3108 or DeYoungN@oasd.org or visit Liz Hofschulte in the main office to request a fee waiver or reduction if a student's family qualifies. Fee reductions or waivers will be considered on a case by case basis upon request of the family.

BEST BUDDIES

Eligibility Requirements: Members must complete an online application at www.bestbuddiesonline.org, attend monthly meetings and complete registration in Family Access & Student Access.

Time Commitment/Location: Best Buddies will meet one time a month after school. Members will also have a quarterly outing to continue to build strong friendships and bonds. Associate members are expected to attend the monthly meetings, while Buddy Pairs will have a greater time commitment to the club.

Best Buddies is a "friendship club" and allows members to pick their level of commitment. Eligibility Requirements: Must be a Junior or Senior only; must apply in April for the following school year. Complete online registration and pay club fee.


Time Commitment/Location: Schedule varies throughout the year.
