



- Filmed all of the varsity football games during his tenure at OHS, taking the film to Milwaukee for processing so that coaches could review the games the next day.

 Mr. Humphrey continued this work after his retirement from OHS
- Filmed all formal dances and OHS graduation ceremonies during his tenure at OHS
- Well into his mid-80's, Lyman continued to serve OHS as the volleyball game manager, swim meet scorer, non-varsity football clock operator, and concession stand manager
- Oconomowoc Citizen of the Year in 1998
- Lyman passed away on September 22, 2009, at 93




