Magdalen "Mamie" Redman

COACH DECEASED: 2020


In an interview about the public perception of the AAGPBL for the National Baseball Hall of Fame, Redman said, "When we played in '56 and took an All-Star team across the country after the league had folded up, we'd go into a community where they knew we were coming and the kids would come out. When the gals would first come out and start getting their equipment out, it was all a big joke to them. Here's a bunch of women who are gonna play ball. And then we'd start warming up and as soon as they could see what you could do, it was suddenly silent and their eyes were popping out."

PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL CAREER:

- Catcher and utility infielder for the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League from 1948-1954
- Recruited by the Kenosha Comets as a utility player in 1948, at the age of 17
- Catcher for the Grand Rapids Chicks from 1950-1954
- Catcher on the touring All-Star Girls Professional Baseball League team in 1956. The team played 100 games against male teams, all over the country
- In 1949, she posted the best fielding average among catchers at .978, then repeated the feat in 1953 after leading all catchers with a .975 average
- Her most productive season came in 1954 when she posted a .240 batting average with 39 runs and 20 RBI in 75 games, all career numbers

OHS COACHING:

- Coached the OHS softball team to the WIAA state tournament in 1979, a feat that has only been duplicated once since then

TEACHING:

- Graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh with a major in mathematics, and minors in physical education and biology
- Math teacher for 37 years at Valders, Mukwonago, and Oconomowoc High Schools
- Physical Education teacher at OHS

SPECIAL RECOGNITIONS:

- Member of the 1953 Championship Team, the Grand Rapids Chicks
- Inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988 during their All-American Girls Professional Baseball League induction ceremony. Of the honor, Redman said, "It's a beautiful display and my name is included in the roster of players there."
- Also a member of the Waupun High School Hall of Fame, the Grand Rapids Sports Hall of Fame, and the Wall of Honor at American Family Field

- Lettered in 1966, 1967, and 1968

- First team All-Conference in his junior and senior seasons

FOOTBALL HONORS:

- Lettered in football his junior year (1966) and senior year (1967)
- Played offensive guard, defensive end, and placekicker
- Named High School All-American and 1st Team All-State on both offense and defense in 1967
- Made all his extra points and field goals (27-27)
- Little Ten Conference Champion with an 8-0 record and ranked 8th in the final state AP rankings
- First-ever football player from OHS to be awarded a Division 1 Scholarship to the University of Wisconsin-Madison

WRESTLING HONORS:

 Lettered in wrestling his junior year (1967) and senior year (1968) while wrestling light heavyweight

POST HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS:

- Played football at the University of Wisconsin for four years and was named team captain his senior season (1971)
- Started a total of 31 games and set nine kicking records including a school record 47-yard field goal
- Was the last Big Ten player to be a full-time position player (linebacker, guard, and tackle) and also be the team's full-time kicker
- Signed as an NFL free agent with the Atlanta Falcons in 1972 and played offensive guard and kicker

POST HIGH SCHOOL ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- UW-La Crosse Offensive Line Coach from 1975-1977
- Waldorf College Offensive Line Coach from 1978-1980
- Luther College Head Wrestling Coach where he coached one National Champion and three All-Americans from 1980-1982
- Luther College Offensive Line Coach from 1982-1995
- Luther College Defensive Line Coach from 1996-2011
- Director of Campus Recreation and Athletic Facilities at Luther College from 1980-2013
- Awarded the Luther College Meritorious Award for 33 years of outstanding service in 2020

OHS AWARDS & CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- State Doubles Champion, along with his brother Whipple Jones, in 1927 and 1928
- Reached the state semifinals in singles tennis in 1928
- The 1927 boys tennis team tied Waukesha for second in the state
- The 1928 boys tennis team tied Milwaukee Washington for first in the state

ATHLETE: 1924-1928 DECEASED: 2001

OHS TEAMS PARTICIPATED:

• Tennis: 1926-1928

• Basketball: 1926-1928

OHS AWARDS & CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- State Doubles Champion, along with his brother Frank Jones. in 1927 and 1928
- The 1927 boys tennis team tied Waukesha for second in the state
- The 1928 boys tennis team tied Milwaukee Washington for first in the state

POST-HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS:

- Graduated from Harvard University in 1932
- A Captain in the Missouri State Guard

- At the outbreak of World War II, he transferred to the US Army Air Corps and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel
- Jones was the founder, builder, and owner of the Aspen Highlands, one of the four ski areas in Aspen, Colorado, from 1956-1992
- In 1992, after the longest continuous ownership of any ski area in Colorado, Jones donated the Highlands to Harvard University. The \$18.3 million gift remains one of the largest donations the University has ever received. The proceeds endow the "Whipple V.N. Jones Cornerstone Scholarship Fund" and the "Whipple V.N. Jones Professor of Economics Chair"

- Inducted into the Colorado Ski Hall of Fame in 2000

- Led the basketball team in steals and assists all 4 years
- 2-time honorable mention in basketball All-State
- Little Ten Conference Player of the Year
- 2-time First Team All-Conference

POST-HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS:

- Full Division 1 scholarship to Wagner College
- 4-year starter on the Wagner College basketball team
- Held an NCAA record at the time for 8/8 3-pointers attempted/made
- Finished 4th all-time in assists, 2nd all-time in steals, 4th all-time in blocks
- Lead the team in steals and assists in her last 3 years on the team
- Lead the team in blocked shots her senior year and was second in blocked shot for the 3 previous years

In looking back at her high school athletics accomplishments, Linscott found a newspaper article that said, "Sophomore Guard Ashley Linscott turned basketball into a contact sport. Her black eye, taped wrist, never-healing floor burns, and plum-colored bruised knees only remind her teammates that there is no such thing as an uncontested loose ball on the court." George Schmid

ATHLETE: 1950-1954 DECEASED: 2018

OHS GRADUATION YEAR: 1954

OHS TEAMS PARTICIPATED:

• Baseball: 1951-1954

Basketball: 1951-1954Football: 1951-1954

OHS AWARDS & CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- Achieved 3 varsity letters in football, 3 varsity letters in basketball, and 3 varsity letters in baseball
- Scored 726 basketball career points between 1952-1954
- Set a conference free throw record in 1953, sinking 66 out of 77 for an average of .840
- Scored 372 points, a season high, in basketball during the 1953-54 school year
- Selected as OHS prom king in 1954

POST-HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS:

- Played baseball at the University of Wisconsin for 4 years and was the top pitcher in the Big 10 his senior year
- Earned 3 varsity letters in baseball while at UW-Madison

- Pitched a perfect game on April 18, 1958, versus Glenview Naval Academy
- Played in the South Dakota Basin League, an independent collegiate minor league, from 1956-1957
- Recorded 18 strikeouts in 1960 as a pitcher for the Rapid City Chiefs. The Chiefs took the league Championship that year
- Signed with the Detroit Tigers
 Organization in 1957 and played for
 two seasons with the Durham Bulls
- The Durham Bulls finished the 1959 season with 70 wins and 60 losses, finishing third in the Carolina League. Schmid pitched for 9 of the wins that season.

SPECIAL RECOGNITIONS:

• After an injury to his elbow in 1960, Schmid ended is baseball career and began working for General Motors Corporation. He worked for GMC for 36 years and retired in 1996

George Schmid's brother, fellow OHS Athletic Hall of Fame inductee, John Kleinschmidt shared the following story:

In the summer of 1960, George and his family returned to Rapid City, SD, after George injured his pitching elbow. He ended up playing a few games with the Rapid City Chiefs upon his return. Many players for Rapid City also played collegiate football and had to leave the team to report for football. George's brother, John Kleinschmidt, had just finished his freshman year the UW-Madison and was playing semi-pro baseball for the Oconomowoc Merchants. George invited John out to Rapid City to be an extra utility player for the Chiefs and it was the only time the brothers ever played in the same sports team because George is five years older than John.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO OCONOMOWOC AREA ATHLETICS:

- President of the Oconomowoc Youth Football Program from 1996-2000
- During his time at the helm of the Youth Football program Bickler, along with many contributors and volunteers, worked with the Town of Ixonia to add youth football space into the improvement plans for Ski Slide Park
- The Youth Football Program continued to build on this success by fundraising for a new bathroom and concessions building at the park. Concessions sales then made it possible for the program to sponsor a press box and storage building, bleachers, goal posts, automatic sprinkler systems, and a scoreboard
- The Loppnow, Mohns, Silkey, and Bickler families, along with many more donors and volunteers made these projects possible

CONTRIBUTIONS TO OHS ATHLETICS:

- Oconomowoc Sports Booster Club (OSBC) member; Booster Club President 2002-2003
- During his time as a Booster Club member, Bickler worked with fellow Athletic Hall of Fame inductee Lyman Humphrey and the Science Club, who managed concessions sales during athletic events

- The Booster Club eventually assumed full responsibility for concessions and increased sales and profits so that the Booster Club could contribute more to the athletics program
- Bickler, along with Keith Farley, Charlie Keepman, and Paul Clarkson, helped to lead the Booster Club's work to identify the weight training and conditioning space needs of OHS student-athletes and worked with Oliver Construction to develop plans for the current Physical Development Center (PDC)
- The OSBC, Bickler, Farley, Keepman, and Clarkson also led fundraising efforts to build the PDC and continued to contribute to the operating expenses for the building
- OASD School Board Member from 2005-2017
- During his time on the OASD School Board, Bickler spearheaded the Athletic Fields Forever project, to develop and fund new athletic facilities at OHS. Along with many contributors, the Athletic Fields Forever committee helped expand and revitalize Rux Stadium, the OHS Field House, the OHS soccer fields, and the OHS baseball and softball fields
