#### William "Bill" Blunck

**ATHLETE:** 1940-1943 **DECEASED:** 1990

It's a tremendous honor to have our patriarch's athletic accomplishments recognized by the Hall of Fame. While we may not be certain about many of the dates listed in his athletic achievements, we can be certain of one thing: Bill excelled in any athletic endeavor he undertook. While he shined brightly on the football field, the basketball court, the track, or in a boxing ring, he was never more at home than on a baseball diamond.

His professional career was short-lived, but it was clear that Bill was a generational talent. Whether it was in any of the aforementioned sports or on a golf course, it seemed like he was the best at whatever he tried. It means a great deal to all of us that he is being recognized for his ability.

The following excerpt from Frank "Peaser" Nissen in the Oconomowoc Enterprise (1995) summarizes his legacy best, "Of all the athletes he has seen through the years, he rates the late Bill Blunck as the best he has ever seen. Nobody comes near him. He was good in every sport he did.



A comment made about Jack and Toni after they passed away said it best, "They did not for their kids or your kids, but for all kids."

#### **CONTRIBUTIONS TO OCONOMOWOC:**

- In 1967, Jack and Toni along with their four children moved to Oconomowoc.
   The family joined and were active at St. Jerome's Church.
- In 1967, Jack joined the Jaycees and Toni joined the Jaycettes. Both Jack and Toni strongly believed in the Jaycee's motto of "Leadership development through community service."
- Mr. Bub served on the Oconomowoc Recreation Board for 27 years, serving as chairman for 15 of those years.
- During his time on the Recreation
   Board, Jack worked to create better
   athletic fields throughout the community
   resulting in the improvement of
   Roosevelt Field and the creation of
   Champion Field.

#### **CONTRIBUTIONS TO OHS ATHLETICS:**

- In 1969, girls sports in Wisconsin started to move away from the Girls Athletic Association (GAA) to interscholastic programs. Toni, with the support of Jack, started attending school board meetings encouraging the Board of Education to expand the athletic program from just boys to include girls programs.
- In 1971, the WIAA added girls gymnastics and girls track and field programs. With the encouragement and support of the Bub's and others, the Oconomowoc School Board also approved both sports at OHS that same year.

- Jack was one of the founders of the Oconomowoc Sports Booster Club and served two terms as the club president.
- Both Jack and Toni volunteered at countless athletic events for many years.
- Jack served as an announcer, ran the scoreboard, and worked in the press box keeping score at a variety of athletic events.
- Jack and Toni both helped to organize Booster Club events, building some of the first homecoming parade floats.
- Jack also had a key role in starting the OSBC annual golf outing and fundraiser which was later renamed in his honor.

Over the years, Jack and Toni attended and followed Oconomowoc sports and athletes. When asked, Jack could tell how each team was doing, which athletes were having an outstanding season, and who qualified and then who placed at State.





#### Keith Farley

**SPECIAL CATEGORY:** Friend of OHS Athletics

As a parent of OHS student-athletes and a spectator at many boys and girls outdoor events, my wife and I saw what other school facilities were like and realized that OHS was falling behind in these types of facilities. We decided to make a difference in what our kids and community needed by giving the kids the best facilities for them to use and perform on. I am very proud of the Oconomowoc Sports Booster Club, the many volunteers, private donors, and contractors who contributed to what OHS has today. As we said many times, "It's for the kids!"

#### **CONTRIBUTIONS TO OHS ATHLETICS:**

- Volunteered with the Oconomowoc Sports Booster Club (OSBC) before being elected as Vice-President and then President.
- Helped to lead the Booster Club's work to identify the weight training and conditioning space needs of OHS student-athletes, ultimately helping to develop plans for the Physical Development Center (PDC) designed and built by Oliver Construction Co.
- Partnered with several other families to establish the financial backing needed to secure the initial construction loans.
   Then helped to fundraise for the cost of the project through private donations and the support of the OSBC.
- Helped to lead the Athletic Fields Forever (AFF) fundraising project along with Fred Begale. This included leading the field design, working with school and school board leadership, and focusing on donor efforts, ultimately raising \$2M through private donations. After five years of hard work, it resulted in facility and field improvements for football, track, soccer, baseball, tennis, and girls softball.

- Led fundraising efforts to build a new press box at Rux Stadium, accomplishing the switch from the old press box to the new press box within one week, ensuring fans never missed announcing at a single game.
- Farley described his contributions as orchestrating a group of unbelievable citizens and volunteers who put their minds, hands, time, and talents toward making athletic facility improvements happen.
