# Summary of Annual OASD Safety Activities

- ✓ Required safety trainings for all staff.
- Site Crisis Response Plans are updated, reviewed and shared with Emergency Responders.
- ✔ Provide electronic school and site maps to Emergency Responders.
- ✓ Fire alarm testing (1,251 devices) and monitoring.
- ✓ Sprinkler system testing (271 devices) and monitoring.
- ✓ Fire, tornado and safety drill requirements completed and logged.
- ✓ AED batteries checked monthly.
- ✓ Use of "Safe Walk" signs as needed district-wide.





# Summary of Annual OASD Safety Activities




# Summary of Annual OASD Safety Activities




# Summary of 2022-23 Safety Committee Activity

Users are locked out after 10 attempts with auto-unlock after 30 min Continued staff notification of upcoming password expiration, for proactive action Staff encouraged to use Chrome password management for unique, immemorable passwords

### Wisconsin Act 125 and Act 118 Requirements For The Use of Seclusion and Physical Restraint in Schools.

2011 Wis. Act 125, which addresses the use of seclusion and physical restraint in public schools. The Act took effect on September 1, 2012. Wis. Act 118, which further addressed the use of seclusion and physical restraint in public schools, had revisions which took effect on March 4, 2020. The Act applies to both regular and special education students and governs the use seclusion or physical restraint.

Per Act 125/118 each year, by October 1, the principal or designee must submit to the school board a report: of the number of incidents of seclusion and physical restraint in the previous year, the total number of students involved in the incidents, and the total number of students with disabilities involved in the incidents. Therefore the purpose of this Board Brief is to meet the reporting requirements of Act 125 and Act 118. **RESTRAINT:** Anytime a child is involuntarily restricted from moving by use of physical force of an adult. This is only used by trained staff using approved techniques as a last resort response to unsafe behavior that has been determined to be a danger to the student or others.

**Seclusion:** The involuntary confinement of students, apart from other students, in a room or area from which the student is physically prevented from leaving.
