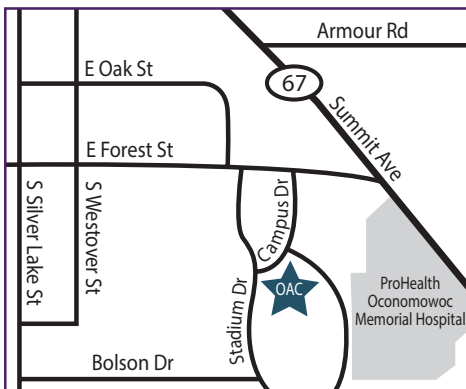

Box Office

The Box Office is located in the lobby of the Oconomowoc Arts Center at 641 East Forest Street, Oconomowoc, WI 53066. The OAC is adjacent to Oconomowoc High School and is just west of ProHealth Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital.

To Purchase Tickets

- In person during regular business hours and 90 minutes prior to curtain through intermission.
- Over the phone by calling 262-560-3172 during regular business hours and 90 minutes prior to curtain through intermission.
- Online at www.TheOAC.net, 24/7 (online sales close 90 minutes prior to curtain).

Payment/Processing

- In person at the box office: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, cash, and local checks accepted.
- Over the phone and online: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express accepted.
- All service fees and taxes are included in the price of the ticket.
- Mailing your order requires an additional postage and handling fee of \$2.50. Place your tickets at will call or have an e-ticket emailed to you for FREE. The box office will not mail tickets less than one week prior to the event.
- Full payment is required on all orders. **ALL SALES FINAL.** Sorry, no refunds.
- Exchanges are permitted 48 hours prior to event time subject to availability. Exchange must be for a ticket for the current season, or converted to a gift certificate, or added as a credit on your account.
- Accessibility to the OAC is available to everyone. Patrons needing special seating or access should call ahead to 262-560-3172. The OAC will provide assistance.
- Hearing impaired patrons may have FREE access to the OAC's FM assisted listening system. Call the box office ahead of time to have one reserved.
- Hearing impaired patrons interested in signing services, and visually impaired patrons interested in audio descriptive services should call the box office at least four weeks prior to the performance to make arrangements. These services are FREE, but may not be available for all performances, subject to availability of professional providers.
- The OAC rarely cancels events due to weather related conditions.

Ways to Save

The OAC offers discounted tickets for seniors ages 60 and older, military personnel, and youth ages 19 and younger (including infants and toddlers) attending age-appropriate performances. We also offer group rates for groups of 10 or more patrons attending the same performance. These savings apply to OAC professional series shows and may not apply to district or community shows.

Putting Group Tickets On Hold

A group is defined by 10 or more patrons attending the same performance. If you are ordering tickets for a group and would like to have us hold your reservation for a later date, you may place the order with a **20% nonrefundable deposit or a nonrefundable order of 10 tickets** (whichever is greater) based on the group rate ticket price and the total number of tickets you would like to put on hold. When finalizing your group order you may do so over the phone or in person no later than six weeks prior to the date of the event. This offer is not available online and applies to group sales only.

Holds do not apply to special events or any shows in the Little Theater.

Occasionally there may be a misprint within this program guide. We will make every effort to correct the error as soon as possible. We reserve the right to change program schedules as needed to accommodate demand or building use conflicts.

OAC Info

No Food is permitted in the theaters except for beverages sold at the OAC concession stand, with the cap or cover on, or where allowed in the lobby area.

Where Can I Sit?

All 759 seats in the Neudecker Main Stage Theater offer excellent views and acoustics. Our box office can be of service with any questions you may have.



The OAC is ADA compliant. We have a limited number of wheelchair accessible seats. Please let the box office representative know that you will need accessible seating at the time of purchase. Our circle driveway allows easy drop off and parking that is next to the front entrance. Wheelchair accessible doors and no steps to the front doors make entering and exiting simple. A gradual slope in the theater allows for easy and safe admittance.

The Little Theater is also ADA compliant. Since this space is used for a variety of different set ups from general seating to a cabaret theater, the number of seats depends on the type of show. Again, the box office can answer any questions or aid you with accessibility concerns.

When to Arrive

It is recommended that patrons arrive approximately 20 minutes prior to the start of a performance. This allows for time to park, check your coat (a free service at the OAC), use the restroom, and find your seat without feeling rushed.

Late Arrivals

To be respectful of both the performers and other audience members, anyone arriving after the performance has begun will be seated only at a suitable break in the show, as determined by house management. Initially, latecomers may be seated at the back of the theater and may not be allowed to move to their assigned seats until intermission.

Seat selection may not be available for patrons purchasing tickets ½ hour prior to performances, and is at the discretion of the box office.

Bringing Children

Patrons are discouraged from bringing any child younger than the age of 6 to performances, unless that particular performance is geared toward or appropriate for younger audiences.

Parents are encouraged to contact the box office for information about the appropriateness of a given performance for younger children.

Booster seats are available. Check with an usher for assistance, first come, first served.

IF YOUR CHILDREN ATTEND A PERFORMANCE WITH YOU, A TICKET WILL NEED TO BE PURCHASED FOR THEM.

This includes children of all ages, including infants and toddlers. **PLEASE NOTE:** Parents are responsible to supervise their children when in the theater and lobby. If your child is being disruptive or causing a distraction, please take them to the lobby and continue to enjoy the performance on the lobby monitor.

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Damn Tall Buildings stoked to shake things up on the OAC's Main Stage

"Damn Tall Buildings brings influences from outside the Appalachian Mountains to their sound, like rootsy rock and American musical theater, but express their original songs with banjo, fiddle, guitar, and bass."

With a distinctive sound that weaves heartfelt lyrics into masterful fiddle, guitar, and bass arrangements, Damn Tall Buildings takes the Oconomowoc Arts Center's Main Stage at 2pm Sunday, April 12, 2026.

Damn Tall Buildings is a celebrated folk-bluegrass band known for their soulful melodies and intricate instrumentals. Based in Brooklyn, Max Capistran (guitar, banjo, vocals), Sasha Dubyk (upright bass, vocals), and Avery Ballotta (fiddle, vocals), have spent over a decade honing their craft through dedicated touring and recording. Embodying a unique blend of Americana roots and contemporary finesse, their magnetic performances resonate deeply, leaving a lasting mark on audiences around the world.

The trio first began playing together 13 years ago as students at Berklee College of Music, often honing harmonies and rhythmic riffs busking on the streets of Boston. Even their name pays homage to their roots in street performance.

"Damn Tall Buildings was inspired by a John Hartford song. We're all fans of this great songwriter and he wrote this song called 'In Tall Buildings' about a gentleman who cuts off his hair and goes to work in tall buildings. He got his start busking and we loved it so much we played on that," explained violin player and vocalist Avery Ballotta.

Their Americana music blends roots, folk, country, blues, and bluegrass into a genre full of heart and storytelling. Damn Tall Buildings adopts that tradition and infuses it with their own Brooklyn-born energy and foot-stomping sound.

"We do bluegrass and old-time music and write our own songs. Bluegrass, folk, world, and a lot of recent stuff is groove-focused with a really nice pulse. We have a lot of fun exploring different types of music, but put it in the lens of this traditional type of string band. We also perform around one microphone, which is traditionally how it's done," added Ballotta.

Since their busking days, they've made four albums: "Cure-All" in 2014, "Damn Tall Buildings" in 2015, "Don't Look Down" in 2019, and "Sleeping Dogs" in 2022. The trio moved from Newberry Street to Brooklyn in 2017, taking their unique blend of Americana roots and contemporary style along with them as they tour across the country.

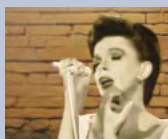
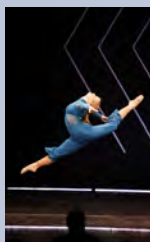

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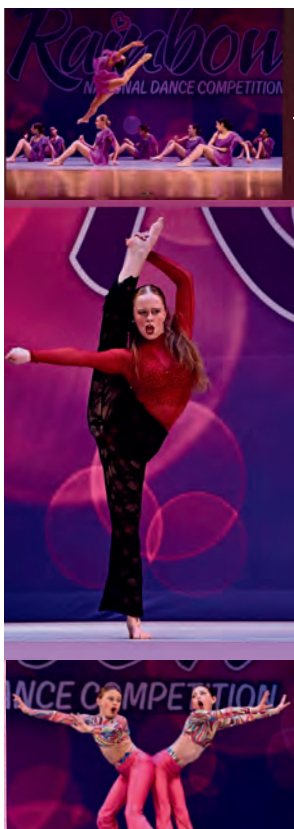


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I Can Go On Singing!

It's June 1969 and a young, struggling songwriter is playing piano late in the evening when iconic actress and singer Judy Garland walks into his bar in Brooklyn, NYC. What transpires is a magical evening of songs, touching stories, and a little soul-searching that helps them both discover their true destinies.

Written, produced, and directed by former Oconomowoc Arts Center director Michael Duncan, *I Can Go on Singing!* will grace the OAC's Main Stage for its second run for two shows at 3pm and 7pm Saturday, September 20.

Presented by Duncan's Fiddlin'Theatricals Production Company, the musical is composed/arranged by Terry Dillon, and stars well-known, local artists Kelly Clifton as Judy Garland, Johnny Rodgers as Roger Stevens - the up-and-coming singer-songwriter, and Doug Jarecki as Carl Slovak - the bartender.

"The idea for this show started more than 20 years ago. I saw a fun cabaret piece featuring a singer accompanied by piano. She did a wonderful job impersonating Judy Garland and I thought it could be a really great theatrical production," explained Duncan. "Judy had an amazing career, but she also experienced horrible situations throughout her life. I wanted to create something that dug deeper into her background and told her whole story."

He got to work researching and writing his script and then ... life happened. No stranger to the stage, Duncan has been directing, acting, writing, producing, and designing professionally for over 50 years. He is a member of Actors Equity Association, an emeritus member of the Wisconsin Presenters Network, and recently founded Fiddlin'Theatrical LLC in 2024.

Duncan also played a big part in helping the Oconomowoc Arts Center become a reality and was the multi-faceted arts facility's first director from 2008 to 2018.

"When I retired in 2018, I suddenly had more time on my hands to focus on my writing. I pulled out the script I had started in 2003, blew the dust off, and for the last five years have been updating, rewriting, and reshaping it," said the Oconomowoc resident. "What I truly love is storytelling and using music to help tell those stories. The theater, for me, is the place to do that."

Duncan teamed up with Wisconsin composer and arranger Terry Dillon for *I Can Go on Singing!* Dillon has been involved in more than 175 musical theater productions as music director, rehearsal pianist, and pit musician for public school, college, and community theater venues. He also spent several years traveling throughout the Midwest performing as a keyboardist with a variety of musical groups. He continues to perform, most notably the Ken Kilian music ensembles.

"The show is much more than a musical. Everyone will recognize the songs that Judy is famous for. Each song inspires touching stories woven in, allowing her to share about her life and some serious moments that happened," added Duncan. "Judy always worried that her life didn't mean anything and that she didn't make a difference. But as the evening unfolds, she and the other characters realize how full and rich her life truly was. The audience is going to love this show."
