MEASURING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING PROGRESS

- Teacher observations
- Daily classroom activities
- Report cards
- Individual student portfolios

HOW TO BE INVOLVED

- Ensure that your child comes to school rested, well-fed and ready to learn
- Talk with your child about the day's activities
- Review homework assignments and schoolwork with your child daily
- Take an interest in what your child is learning; recognize your child's achievements and progress
- Read with and to your child daily
- Engage your child in learning games and conversations

- Understand the school rules
- Work in cooperation with your child's teachers and school staff
- Monitor your child's television/ device viewing habits and outside activities
- Attend parent/teacher conferences
- Join your school Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)



WHEN STUDENTS COMPLETE FIVE-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN, THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO:

COMMUNICATION ARTS

READING, WRITING, SPEAKING AND LISTENING

- Recognize and name capital and lower case letters and sounds
- Connect sounds to letters
- Recognize rhyming words
- Identify beginning and ending sounds
- Sequence events and stories
- Retell stories
- Understand that print has meaning
- Recognize that literature comes in many forms
- Acquire emergent (beginning) reading skills
- Recognize high-frequency words
- Participate actively in shared reading and writing activities
- Listen attentively
- Develop listening and speaking skills
- Recognize that writing goes from left to right
- Print name correctly
- Convey ideas through pictures and writing
- Express ideas in complete sentences
- Write a simple sentence
- Apply letter sounds to writing
- Begin to use spaces between words

- Use sight words (e.g., and, to, the, we like, I, a, my) in writing
- Begin to use conventional spelling
- Use pencil, crayon, and scissors appropriately
- Demonstrate proper book care and library checkout procedures
- Demonstrate proper library behavior making and conflict resolution skills
- Develop awareness of the world of work including nontraditional occupations

MATHEMATICS

OASD students utilize the *Bridges in Mathematics* curriculum

- Actively participate in classroom mathematics activities
- Estimate size, number, and weight
- Create, extend, record and describe patterns
- Sort objects by two attributes (color, size and shape)
- Identify, label and sort geometric shapes
- Recognize and apply principles of symmetry
- Rote count by 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s beyond 100
- Count using one-to-one correspondence
- Count backward from ten or more

- Identify, read and write numbers to 30
- Solve simple number stories using addition and subtraction
- Develop meaning for operations
- Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them
- Attend to precision
- Reason abstractly and quantitatively
- Construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning with others
- Model with mathematics
- Use appropriate tools strategically
- Look for and make use of structure
- Look for and express regularity

GUIDANCE

- Identify feelings and express them in an appropriate manner
- List steps for protecting personal safety
- Identify the difference between healthy and unhealthy choices
- Recognize how each member needs to cooperate to achieve group goals
- Develop awareness of problemsolving, decision-making and conflict resolution skills
- Develop awareness of the world of work including nontraditional occupations



WHEN STUDENTS COMPLETE FIVE-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN, THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO:

ART

- Use a variety of art materials appropriately
- Explore many art forms such as drawing, painting, and sculpture
- Creatively express ideas through various mediums

SOCIAL STUDIES

- Understand that people have different customs, celebrations, and traditions
- Recognize that every individual and their family are unique and important
- Recognize that all people have feelings that should be respected
- Recognize the importance of the community and community helpers

SCIENCE AND HEALTH

- Observe and discuss the concepts of change in solids and liquids
- Observe and discuss similarities and differences in living things
- Observe and discuss life cycles
- Identify foods, food sources and the importance of eating healthy foods
- Recognize body parts and cleanliness as a part of healthy living
- Understand the importance and functions of the five senses

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Perform manipulative skills—throwing, catching, kicking, striking and dribbling
- Play simple games
- Demonstrate good sportsmanship

MUSIC

- Identify and use loud and soft sounds
- Recognize the difference between the speaking and singing voice
- Develop an appreciation for many forms of music
- Move to various rhythms
- Explore various musical instruments
- Learn simple patterned songs
