Repeating Courses

O POWER: DEVELOPING THE COMPLETE ATHLETE FOR STUDENTS ENTERING 7TH & 8TH GRADES

SIX-WEEK COURSE AT OCONOMOWOC HIGH SCHOOL – JUNE 10 – JULY 18

This course allows 7th and 8th-grade athletes to train with coaches from multiple high school sports in a highly structured and safe environment. The goal of the 7th and 8th-grade O-Power program is to introduce athletes to the core movement patterns that athletes need to master to train effectively when they enter high school and participate in O-Power.

Athletes will begin each session with a 30-minute field session that includes instruction on fundamental movement patterns needed for an athlete to maximize their speed and power. This session will include sprint technique, plyometric technique, and change of direction technique.

The athletes will then have a 30-minute session in the weight room. In the weight room, athletes will be exposed to the core movement patterns used in the weight room using their body weight and light weights.
