



## **SILVER LAKE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL INFORMATION FOR 2023 – 2024**

### **ONLINE REGISTRATION: July 10<sup>th</sup> – August 2<sup>nd</sup>**

For current students and families, online registration opens up July 10<sup>th</sup>. If you are a new to district family, you will need to complete the new student online enrollment process before completing online registration. If you need help with online registration, please contact our school office.

### **5<sup>th</sup> GRADE MOVIN ON TO INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL (August 10<sup>th</sup> 8:15am – 12:15pm)**

Get a head start on Intermediate School life! Students will be oriented to the intermediate school buildings and establish a connection with an eighth-grade WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) leaders. Students will practice communication skills, learn positive behavior, and study skills to help with intermediate school learning. The orientation is full of fun activities and will give students a head-start in feeling at home in their new intermediate school. Advanced registration IS NOT REQUIRED at this time; all incoming 5<sup>th</sup>-grade families will receive information and an invitation during the summer.

### **SLI OPEN HOUSE**

Open House for all Silver Lake students and families attending 2023-2024 school year will be held on Tuesday, August 29<sup>th</sup> from 3pm – 5pm. Please make sure you bring your class schedule (so you know where to go) and school supplies with you.

### **2023-2024 SCHOOL FEES**

These fees are posted on your Family Access account. Any additional or optional fees you will be able to add yourself.

- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade: annual fee, agenda planner and padlock
- 6<sup>th</sup> Grade: annual fee and any course fees
- 7<sup>th</sup> Grade: annual fee and any course fees
- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade: annual fee and any course fees

**Optional Fees:**

- Agenda planner, TI-30 calculator, earbuds, goggles, padlock, club and athletic fees
- Chromebook Insurance – this is accidental drop/damage insurance for your child’s Chromebook. It does not cover lost/stolen devices, intentional damages, or the ac adapter.

**CLUBS AND ATHLETICS**

All students who are planning to participate in any club or sport should make the fee payment online. You will also need to go into your Family Access and your child will need to go into their Student Access to complete the **co-curricular registration**. Clubs are open to all grades, athletics are for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders with the exception of wrestling, dance, and cross country. Sixth graders are allowed to participate in wrestling, dance, and cross country. A physical is required in-order to participate in a sport. The physical is good for 2 years. WIAA Physical cards should be turned into the office the first week of school. The co-curricular registration must be completed before the club or sport begins. More information is on our website under the Athletics & Clubs tab.

**GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION**

The 2023-2024 school year begins on **Tuesday, September 5th at 7:30am**. The school day runs from 7:30am – 2:55pm. We are very excited to begin the school year and work with all of you. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to call Silver Lake School’s office at 262-560-4309.

**School Hours:** 7:30am – 2:55pm. Students should arrive at school between 7:15am – 7:25am to get to class on time.

**Supply Lists:** Supply lists can be found on our Silver Lake website under “Students & Families”/ “Back to School Information.” On the right side of the screen you will see the supply lists.

**Bus Schedules:** You will find your child’s bus route information in your Family Access/upper right corner district links/bus drop down/bus route lookup/Oconomowoc Transport. Username and password are both your primary phone number. Routes are usually all scheduled by mid-August. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD KNOWS THEIR BUS ROUTE BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

**Food Service Information:** The Intermediate school will be serving breakfast from 7:15am – 7:30am in the cafeteria. Student’s lunch codes remain the same throughout the entire time they are in the Oconomowoc Area School District. Students must use their lunch code to purchase breakfast and lunch. No cash can be accepted at the lunch line. Please remember to keep your lunch code safe. Do not share this information with friends. At the Intermediate level students have more options for lunch. Please make sure your child knows to take something from the salad bar and a milk along with their lunch choice. This will make it a complete meal. If they don’t take something from the salad bar and a milk with their lunch choice you will be charged ala carte for each item. Parents, you can limit the ala carte items through Aramark.

**Free and Reduced Applications:** Free and Reduced applications will be available online or in the school offices by the end of August. Families need to fill out an application unless notified by Aramark. Regular school lunches are allowed as part of the free and reduced program. Ala carte items are not included and are the responsibility of the family. If this pertains to your family, please discuss this with your child.

**School Pictures:** School pictures are scheduled for **Wednesday, September 6, 2023**, during the school day. Picture Re-take day is scheduled for **Tuesday, October 10, 2023**. This is for any student who did not get their pictures taken on Sept. 6th or students who want a re-take done. You must bring in your original school pictures in-order to get re-take picture done.

**Lockers:** Lockers will be assigned in August. All students are required to have a school issued lock on their locker. The locks have to be paid for before your child receives one.

It is in the best interest of your child that they do not share their combination to their locks to anyone. For security reasons, all lockers should be properly locked at all times and all personal items be labeled.

**Family Access:** Family Access is a web based service that allows parents to view their child's information including assignments, report cards, lunch, etc. If you have not signed up for Family Access, please go to our website Family Resources, Family Access. There you can register for it. You will need this for communication, to pay fees including lunch fees, registration for school and sports/clubs, etc.

**Student Message/Drop Offs:** Any message or items dropped off during the day will be put on a table in the office. It is the responsibility of the student to come pick up their message or item that was dropped off. We will email the teacher that there is something in the office to pick up, but we cannot interrupt learning time by calling into the classroom.

**Volunteering in the classroom or on a field trip:** If you would like to volunteer in the classroom or on a field trip you need to make sure you have a background check on file. To complete a background check go to our website – Silver Lake Intermediate School/Students & Families/Resources/Volunteer. You will receive an email from [clientservices@bib.com](mailto:clientservices@bib.com) when you submit your information to SecureVolunteer AND when your background check has been completed. This is the only way to fill out a background check and must be done prior to signing up to volunteer.

**Doctor notes for attendance:** Students who are scheduled for any type of doctor appointment (medical, dental, orthodontic, other) should request a doctor's note stating they were at a medical appointment. This allows your child's absence to be coded differently and will not appear on the attendance reports that are run monthly. The doctor note can be handed into the office after the appointment or the doctor's office can fax the note to 262-560-4318.

**Important Note:** To ensure student safety please supply the health room with medications your student will need at school PRIOR to the first day of school.

# Classroom Snacks



Research has shown that a child's diet has a strong impact on their behavior as well as their capacity to learn. The Oconomowoc Area School District, as part of their student wellness policy, has developed some guidelines to help choose healthy snacks that will provide energy, nutrition and sustenance while limiting unnecessary sugar and fat. Please consider these when it comes to sending a snack for your individual child. For your convenience, the district food service department can also provide healthy classroom snacks for your child's class at a reasonable cost. Please call the food service department at (262) 560-2146 at least 48 hours in advance for information on price and availability of these items.

## Recommended Snacks

Fresh fruits

Fresh vegetables

100% fruit juices

Dried fruits (raisins, banana chips, etc.)

Party mix (variety of cereals, pretzels, etc.) – cannot contain nuts

Low sodium and whole grain crackers

Baked corn tortilla and baked snack chips, pretzels

Low fat muffins, granola bars and cookies

Bagels – whole grain are best

Low fat pudding, Jell-O, or applesauce cups

Flavored yogurt

Popcorn, rice cakes and soy crisps

Dry cereals – Whole grain cereals are best. Avoid brightly colored, sugary cereals. Cheese and crackers

Meat sandwiches (Ham, turkey, roast beef)

Please do not bring **candy, soda, regular chips, and other high-fat, high-sugar snacks**. Foods that contain sugar as one of the first two ingredients listed are considered to be of low nutritional value and should **not** be brought to class.

You will be notified via classroom letter in the beginning of the school year if there are food allergies in the classroom that require food restrictions.
