At the end of another year of learning at Oconomowoc High School, it is clear to see our students moving forward and achieving more than those who came before them. This forward movement is the result of many hours of planning and care on the part of a very talented staff, dedicated to the students they serve, students who are committed to defining their futures and parents who are investing in the growth of their children. This partnership can only serve in the future to contribute to even greater things for the children of this community.

### ACHIEVEMENTS

Every year we take a moment to reflect on the accomplishments of the year and like so many years in the recent past, our students have done amazing things and received recognition in many ways. I want to name just a few:

- OHS Drama students earned 16 Tommy Awards for their production of *Singing in the Rain*, the most in the State. (Over the past five years, OHS has garnered the most Tommy awards every year of any school in the State.)

- Athletics earned the fourth consecutive Wisconsin Little Ten All Sport Award.
- The College Board recognized 33 OHS students as AP Scholars, based on last spring's Advanced Placement testing at OHS. This is the highest number of OHS students attaining AP Scholar status since the College Board began that designation in 2011. To be identified as an AP Scholar, a student must have a score of 3 or above on at least three Advanced Placement exams, the threshold that most colleges use to award college credit for the course.
- More students took Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate classes than ever before in the history of the school at almost 1000 exams.
- Six students were recognized at the National Future Business Leaders Association competition for their work.
