Dear Meadow View Substitute,

Welcome to our school and thank you for joining us for the day! This is Meadow View's second year as a Positive Behavior Intervention & Support (PBIS) school. We wanted to share a little information with you about PBIS to help you have a great day.

PBIS is **The Wild Cat Way** at Meadow View. This means that we reinforce the behaviors of students who are following our school expectations and provide support in a positive manner to the students who may need extra assistance in following school rules and expectations. For example, if you are walking students in the hallway and one child begins to run, you might say, "We walk in the hallways, Ben." This is a way to positive correct behavior rather than saying, "Stop running in the hall!" Don't forget to reinforce students who are following expectations by stating things such as, "The front of the line is doing a great job remembering to walk quietly!"

At Meadow View, we have certain school-wide expectations of appropriate behavior for all students. These expectations represent our School and The Wild Cat Way:

- Be Respectful**
- Be Responsible**
- Be Safe**

We have also established **The Wild Cat Way** expectations that are specific to every common area in the school building. Please see the attached list to see how we follow these expectations throughout the school.
