



2021-2022 OASD COVID-19 PLAN

The District will monitor COVID-19 cases among staff and students and if the number of positive cases increases within a specific classroom, school, or district-wide, additional mitigation measures will be implemented where and when needed. Our goal is to keep kids healthy and in school. These additional mitigation measures may include, but are not limited to, masking, cohort groups, and changes to quarantine procedures.



INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

- Face-to-face learning, 5 days a week
- Athletics, clubs, and extracurricular activities are fully available
- Concerts, field trips, special events offered
- Children in isolation or self-quarantine can receive learning materials from school



FACE COVERINGS

- Recommended for students, staff, and visitors
- Required on school buses and vans by Federal mandate



VACCINATION & TESTING

- Vaccination is not required for students, staff, or visitors
- Families can share vaccination status with Health Services if they choose
- COVID-19 testing will not be provided on-site
- OASD will only accept Rapid Antigen or PCR test results from a licensed or certified entity



QUARANTINE & ISOLATION

- Quarantine due to close-contact will not be required
- Families may choose self-quarantine if they suspect close-contact
- Families must notify their school attendance line of self-quarantine
- Isolation after a positive COVID-19 diagnosis will be required
- OASD will continue contact tracing



MONITORING

- OASD will continue contact tracing
- Families will be notified of confirmed positive cases if their child may have had close contact
- OASD will share data on positive COVID-19 cases among students and staff weekly



CLEANING PROCEDURES

- Schools will be cleaned and sanitized daily and nightly
- High-touch surfaces will be disinfected throughout the day
- Air systems will continue to cycle fresh air early in the morning, prior to the start of school daily



HEALTHY HABITS

- Students will continue good hand hygiene routines
- Hand sanitizer stations will remain in common areas
